Chairperson's Report

It has been exciting to see Heart of the Bays take on our new identity and branding over the past 12 months, the foundation for which was put in place during 2022/23. The final steps in our restructure are a new member of staff, a new website, and a new constitution.



Our new strategy has been to increase our focus on ensuring the Heart of the Bays Community Centre and St Anne's Hall (which we are contracted to manage for the Auckland Council) are put to the best possible use for you, our community.

With only one (albeit very efficient!) part-time Community Centre Manager, Debbie, the Board had to become more involved in the day-today work of the Community Centre to achieve this goal. I would like to recognise the Board's engagement in this work, which has made all the difference. As volunteers, they have shown their commitment to our community with their unwavering support of Heart of the Bays.

My heartfelt thanks to Kathy, Pam E, Martin, Wendy, Tasha, Margaret and Beks for all your help. Michelle our bookkeeper has been a valuable asset, helping us to understand the implications of our financial position.

Special thanks must also go to our Funding Partners for last year, Hibiscus and Bays Local Board, the Lotteries Commission and Pub Charities. As we move forward this year, we will be seeking additional funding sources to ensure that we can provide the excellent service that East Coast Bays deserves. While our long-planned refurbishment has been delayed for now, we are grateful to the Council for working with us to make smaller improvements to the building. These will make a difference in the smooth running of the Centre.

A critical part of enabling and supporting our community has been to focus on improving customer service, resources, and support. Debbie (Centre Manager) has very effectively implemented the changes needed to achieve this, which has also helped to increase bookings and income.

Events

Reflecting our move away from larger events run in the past, the many smaller events we have run during the year have proved popular and included Jingle Mingle, Easter Bunny visit and Volunteer Appreciation morning tea. See more later in this report.

Active Ageing Expo

Arguably our biggest success was our Active Ageing Expo held in November at the Recreation Centre. Promoting positive activities for older adults, the four-hour event showcased many of the groups who use the community centre as a venue, as well as other local community groups.

With visitor numbers exceeding 350 and an amazingly positive response, we are anticipating an even larger attendance when we run this event again on 14 November 2024.

While the expo is based around community organisations, this year's event will see a printed program allowing local businesses who support our older residents to advertise their services.

Projects

Resilience project

Following the floods last year, the Hibiscus and Bays Local Board provided funds to set up resilience network groups in East Coast Bays.



We are part of the Browns Bay/Rothesay Bay Resilient Communities Network, providing a venue for meetings and administrative support.

The aim of this ongoing project is to ensure our communities are prepared, via timely information and support, for any future major weather events.

Community Pantry

Setting up a community pantry in Browns Bay has been talked about for a while now and Debbie is working with other organisations on the Village Green to make it happen. The Local Board has provided funding to build the pantry and get it started. There have been some major challenges around the location, but we hope these will be resolved soon.

As I step down from the position of Chair, my heartfelt thanks to everyone who has supported me and Heart of the Bays over the last 12 months – our team at the Community Centre, the Heart of the Bays Board, our supporters, and you – our community.






Family Growth and Thrive Charitable Trust

Community Collaboration Projects 2023-24

Browns Bay/Rothesay Bay Community Resilience project

Following last year's floods and the lack of information provided to the community, the Local Board and community groups decided to create a resilience community network to provide information. and resources for our local communities in the event of another major weather event.

With seed funding from the Local Board, a steering group has been set up and an initial plan has been produced. We look forward to creating resources and information that will help our communities.





Community Collaboration Projects 2024-25 (continued)

Digital Seniors

Heart of the Bays is working with the Digital Seniors project on the North Shore to bring one-to-one help for seniors who need help with technology.

Digital Seniors operates nine hubs across the North Shore, providing free one-on-one support for seniors with their technical devices. East Coast Bays Library hosts one of our hubs weekly on a Tuesday morning from 10 am to 12 pm (excluding January). Between July 2023 and May 2024, Digital Seniors volunteer coaches gave 180 volunteer hours to help 231 seniors at 180 hub sessions at the library.

Digital Seniors supported and attended the Active Ageing Expo along with our corporate partners, BNZ. BNZ provided free Scam Savvy training at the library during the expo.



Heart of the Bays has been active in supporting the mahi of Digital Seniors. We are part of the community partners group working with Digital Seniors to achieve collective impact in supporting seniors in North Auckland.

Represented by Pam Martin, we have actively supported the codesign of a Tech Expo to be held on 10 November. The expo will bring together over 60 stalls of senior-relevant technology at Eventfinda Stadium. Exhibitors will showcase technology to support seniors in health, home and accessibility, transport, safety, connection, fun and support. There will be an intergenerational zone with vintage technology such as rotary dial phones where seniors can challenge their younger whānau to operate technology from their era along with other entertainment, interesting speakers, food and seating.

Financial Commentary

Treasurer's Report | Financial year ended 31 March 2024

Following a tumultuous 2023, this financial year has been all about consolidation.

For several years, Heart of the Bays recorded an annual deficit largely attributable to Human Resource costs for which funding was no longer received.

As a result of dedication and a lot of hard work from the Governance Board, Management and Bookkeeper, Heart of the Bays is back on the right path to financial sustainability.

For the financial year in review total revenue earned is \$229,117 and total expenditure is \$168,070, giving rise to the surplus of \$61,047. Last year's recorded deficit was \$42,969.

Operating Revenue

This year saw Heart of the Bays once again receive the majority of revenue from it usual sources. These being Grants and Service Agreements with Auckland Council and in conjunction with the Hibiscus & Bays Local Board. \$42,429 in funding to operate the Bays Community Centre and St Anne's Hall, and \$18,662 in events funding.

Room and Hall hire revenue across both venues totaled \$79,299, which was a rise from the previous year's \$62,274, this being reflective of the high occupancy rates and excellent scheduling skills of our Centre Manager, Debbie.

Operating Revenue (continued)

Heart of the Bays continues to support groups in an umbrella capacity. This year has seen successful relationships with the Hibiscus Coast Youth Hauora Network and currently Trash Free Taiaotea with the collaborated ellort of establishing a community pantry in Browns Bay. Heart of the Bays appreciates the small administration fee received from umbrella work, which contributes to the administrative costs of these relationships.

Pub Charity Ltd generously granted \$1,796 towards the purchase of four new heavy duty table tennis tables for groups to use at St Anne's Hall.



Operating Expenditure

Total operating expenditure for the year was \$168,070, down from the previous year's \$228,164. This is due to lower payroll costs, reduced event costs and this year the run-out of our strategic activation grant. All other costs remain comparable to last year. There have been no extraordinary expenditure items to note.



Looking to the Future

Tight budgetary control over expenditure and continued careful financial management will be key to further consolidation of this year's result, where Heart of the Bays has essentially been brought back from the brink.

As always, pursuing new funding sources and opportunities remains key for the future growth of Heart of the Bays.
